

Background

The Ukrainian Council of Churches and Religious Organizations (UCCRO) was established in 1996 as an interdenominational institution, aiming to unite the efforts of various denominations to focus on the spiritual revival of Ukraine, coordination of interconfessional dialogue in Ukraine and abroad, participation in a legislative process on church-state issues, and the implementation of comprehensive charitable actions. Today, it is one of the largest non-governmental institutions in Ukraine, representing over 95% of all religious communities in Ukraine. UCCRO works closely with the Ukrainian government, civil society, and international organizations, including on the issues pertaining to Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine.

Following a meeting with the UCCRO in June 2023, Razom has been working with the UCCRO leadership on a high-level visit to the United States for a series of meetings with the US Senate leadership, church counterparts, local communities, and the media, as well as public-facing events. The previous visit of UCCRO to Canada and the United States took place in 2012 with support from the Temerty Foundation.

Objectives

- Discuss the state of religious freedoms in Ukraine and address disinformation surrounding it.
- Exchange information with counterparts in the United States on how religious communities across Ukraine have responded to Russia's invasion and the high toll Russia's aggression has taken on religious life inside Ukraine.
- Demonstrate the unity and diversity of Ukrainian religious communities in the face of a full-scale invasion of Ukraine.

Details

The trip will take place between **October 28 - November 5, 2023**. Below is a tentative timeline and program for the visit:

- October 28 The UCCRO delegation arrives in Washington, DC.
- October 29-November 2 Meetings with the Senate Leadership, the Executive Branch, think tanks, media engagements, and a reception in Washington, DC.
- November 2 Travel to Houston, Texas, and an evening event.
- November 2-5 Meetings with the church counterparts and government officials in Houston, Texas, and local media engagements.
- November 6 The UCCRO delegation returns to Ukraine.
